



Every year, between June and November, hundreds of thousands of wildebeest, zebra and other antelopes migrate from the Serengeti in Tanzania to the Masai Mara in Kenya in search of pasture.

Depending on the period of the year you might choose to come on safari, you will be able to see and photograph these large herds dotting the savanna of rolling hills and even perhaps see a crossing over the Mara River. It's always a fabulous spectacle.

Day 1 – Nairobi > Masai Mara

Rollings plains, open savannah dotted with acacia patches, The Masai Mara National Reserve is one of Africa's most iconic reserve and home to a diverse and abundant wildlife. It's a good 5-hour journey from Nairobi, so an early breakfast and departure is in order so as to arrive at the lodge in time for a swim and lunch. Afternoon game-drive.

Dinner and overnight at Mara Serena Safari Lodge (full board) or similar.

Lala salama. Lakini,... remember: anapolia punda usiku basi anabashiri kuwa pana shetani hapo.


Day 2 – Masai Mara

Dawn. Coffee. And it's time for an early morning game drive to try and catch the sunrise. It's cool, wrapped in your Masai blanket, you will see the animals emerging from the mist between the acacia trees. The thought of bacon and fried eggs will bring you back to the lodge for breakfast. The day then begins to warm up, as you set off to discover the magic of the Mara's different ecosystems and its fauna. Lunch. Relax. Then again game drive until sunset. These magnificent savannahs are a paradise for the diversity of herbivores.

You will see them all: Thomson's Gazelles, Coke's Hartebeest, Topi, Eland, Impala, Masai Giraffe, Buffalo, Elephant... And you will also see the predators: lions and cheetahs, hyenas and jackals, maybe a leopard...! You can even find these big cats hunting, with vultures circling overhead. Return to the lodge at sunset. Overnight at Mara Serena Safari Lodge (or similar) on full board basis.
